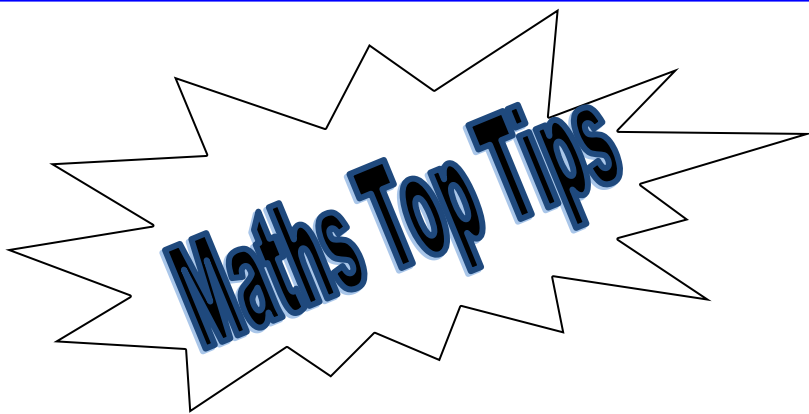




Counting

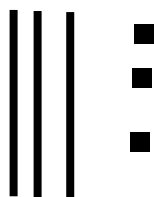
- Practise counting a group of items from different places.
- Start counting from different numbers and stop at different numbers too!!
- Count in 2s, 10s and 5s starting at different numbers.

Eg: 23,33,43,53,etc

- Remember to count backwards as well.

Calculations

- Use mathematical vocabulary.
- Always ask 'Can you solve it in your head?' 'What would be the best way to solve it?'
- Until confident use objects to add together or subtract.
- Encourage children to draw pictures.
